

RAINBOW AND TRAMWAY TRAILS - Beautiful, narrow, winding drives through the high karri forest. Several picnic areas and walk trails are located along the drives.

PEMBERTON TROUT & MARRON HATCHERY - Trout are bred here for stocking the waterways in the area and for sale to aquaculture breeding programmes. Our native freshwater lobster, marron, are also bred and researched here. Contact Tourist Centre for tour times.

PEMBERTON POOL - Formed in 1928 when public subscriptions enabled the dam wall to be built across the Letroy Brook. It's an ideal place for a family picnic and although swimming has been a favourite pastime at the pool since, it is at your own risk as the water is untreated.

PEMBERTON FOREST PARK - After visiting the **KARRI FOREST DISCOVERY CENTRE**, enjoy the walk trails bird hides and interpretive panels depicting the birds and trees of this 122 hectare park.

PEMBERTON SAWMILL - Rebuilt in the 1960's after the original 1913 mill burnt down. It is the largest karri sawmill in the South West. For information on guided tours contact the Pemberton Tourist Centre.

FOREST INDUSTRIES CENTRE - Guides tours of the sawmill depart from here weekdays.

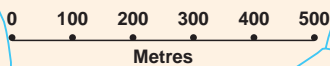
FINE WOODCRAFT GALLERY & GRYPHON'S GARDEN CAFE - This complex features fine art and furniture, woodcraft, ceramics and jewellery by local artisans. Refreshments available from the tea-rooms.

KARRI VISITORS CENTRE - A 'one stop shop' for all tourist information and bookings. It houses the **PEMBERTON TOURIST CENTRE**, the **PEMBERTON PIONEER MUSEUM** and the **KARRI FOREST DISCOVERY CENTRE** which features interactive displays and a film.

FOREST ENCOUNTERS BY TRAM OR TRAIN - A steam train runs on weekends and school holidays from Easter to November, north to Eastbrook and Lyall. Trams run daily to Warren River Bridge all year except Christmas Day and periodically to Northcliffe except in winter. Contact the Pemberton Tourist Centre for further timetable information.
