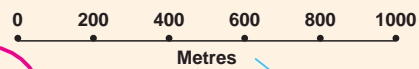




Wyndham



BLOOD DRAIN CROCODILE LOOKOUT - Former outlet from meatworks attracted many large crocodiles. They are now fed daily for the benefit of tourists. See Crocodile Warning.

KOOLAMA WRECK - A well-known State Ship, it was hit by Japanese bombs near Darwin in 1942. After limping all the way to Wyndham, it sank just 40 metres from the jetty.

WYNDHAM WHARF - Until 1919 this was the town's ship-loading facility. Now it is a popular fishing spot.

ANTHON LANDING - Site of the first wharf in the East Kimberley - built, 1894; destroyed by fire, 1944.

THE RESIDENCY - This building was constructed as the home of Wyndham's residing magistrate. The ruins are what remain of walls which were once 7 metres high. The front wall facing the Gulf had a large white marker painted on it as a navigational aid for shipping.

OLD MEATWORKS - Built in 1919 as the town's sole large industry, it brought economic stability until its closure in 1985. It burnt in 1987.

WYNDHAM PORT HERITAGE TRAIL - Provides an easy tour of the buildings and sites in the old town centre.

GULLY CEMETERY - Includes the graves of members of the earliest station families who began the pastoral industry in the late 1800s.

PORT DISPLAY - Collection of old trains used to carry freight to and from ships along a short railway line.

DREAMTIME PARK (WARRIU) - The Bicentennial project of Derby. A group of large statues depicting an Aboriginal family and their animals.

BASTION BILLY CART RACE - Each August carts reach speeds up to 100 kph as they roll downhill competing for prizes totalling thousands of dollars.

THREE MILE VALLEY - Contains on one site many of the typical features of the rugged Kimberley landscape.

AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST BOAB TREE IN CAPTIVITY - Because it is fenced off, this large boab, 20 metres around, is humorously said to be 'in captivity'.

BEND CEMETERY - Contains the graves of the many men who died during construction of the meatworks between 1913 and 1918.

AFGHAN CEMETERY - The camel drivers who provided the first freight service in the Kimberley are buried here with tombstones facing Mecca.

CONCRETE CROCODILE - A larger than life sculpture 20 metres long of the fearsome saltwater crocodiles that abound in Wyndham waters.

CROCODILES
Be aware of signs erected at places where crocodiles may be found.
Do not:
1. Swim or wade.
2. Clean fish on or near water.
3. Camp next to the water's edge.
4. Allow your pets near the water.
5. Dangle legs or arms over the edge of boats.
6. Stand at the water's edge when fishing.
Absence of warning signs does not signify a safe area. Seek local or expert advice before swimming, camping, fishing or boating.

Tourist Information Centre
POST OFFICE, MUSEUM - Built in the old colonial style about 1900. More than 60 years a post office, it's now a tourist office and museum.

DROVERS MEMORIAL BENCH - Commemorates the pioneers who braved extreme conditions to bring herds of cattle here for export.
