

Origins of Street Names in PERTH

Perth was officially declared on the 12th August, 1829 by Sir James Stirling under instruction from the Secretary of State for the Colonies and War, Sir James Murray, who represented the constituency of Perthshire, Scotland. The ceremony included the cutting down of a tree by Mrs Helen Dance, wife of Captain William Dance, commander of H.M.S. Sulphur on the allotment set apart for military barracks in Barrack Street. A plaque set in the footpath now marks the place where this event occurred.
